Description and Uses Summary	<p>This map shows threatened species locations within NRM North. The data is sourced from the Natural Values Atlas, which provides authoritative, comprehensive information on Tasmania's natural values. This dataset is maintained and updated as required. Information on the dataset can be found at https://www.naturalvaluesatlas.dpiw.tas.gov.au. This threatened fauna species information is important as both national and state listed species are subject to legislative protection.</p> <p>Listed threatened species fall into 4 categories at the State level. These are extinct, endangered, vulnerable and rare. At the national level the species are listed as extinct, critically endangered, endangered and vulnerable. Locations for extinct species are not shown on the map.</p> <p>The region contains an estimated 63 threatened fauna species (excluding extinct species). Listed species include the Wedge tailed eagle, the Spotted-tail quoll, the Tasmanian Devil and the Blind velvet-worm. Some species such as the Eastern barred-bandicoot are listed at the national level but are not currently regarded as threatened in Tasmania and are not shown.</p>
